### **EASTER**

Easter is a Christian holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. According to Christian history, Jesus was crucified on a Friday (Good Friday) and rose again three days later on Easter Sunday.

Good is traditionally a day of sorrow, penance, and fasting. **Holy Saturday**, also called **Easter Vigil**, is the traditional end of Lent.



It is the most important Christian festival, and the one celebrated with the greatest joy. The date of **Easter** changes each year, and several other Christian festivals fix their dates by reference to **Easter**. Easter Sunday is 31st March this year.

### YEAR 5 VISIT THE UNIVERSITY OF LIVERPOOL

As part of their History topic, on Monday 4th March, Year 5 visited the University of Liverpool.

They explored the buildings around the University and how they link to the United States and discussed how the buildings could be used in the future. In the afternoon they worked with local artist, Jioni Warner, and worked on the 'A Museum for Me' art project.

The trip was very informative and the children gained a wealth of knowledge about the Transatlantic Slave Trade. The children were all very interested and engaged, asking an array of thoughtful and well-articulated questions. We are two thirds of the way through the school year. Our school attendance currently stands at 92.34%. This is still significantly less than the 97% or above target the Government wants our school to reach. For us to improve our current attendance %, we need every child in, on time, every day. Absence should be for genuine illness reasons and not if your child is tired or going away for the weekend. Genuine absences will be authorised but anything that isn't will be recorded as unauthorised and the Education Welfare Service will become involved, possibly resulting in a fine. If you have any questions or need to speak to a member of the Attendance Team, please see Reception and they will make a time for you. Our school aim is to work with Parents/Carers in creating higher attendance and punctuality for our pupils.



For children and young people up to the age of 25

When you've been referred to one of the Liverpool CAMHS partners, you and your family can access a range of support and tools whilst waiting for your initial appointment (often known as an 'assessment').





Children and young people in Liverpool aged 10-25 have 24-hour access to self-help materials and resources. Direct support and counselling are also available during Mon-Fr 12-10 pm and Sat 6 pm-10 pm.

### **TEXT**

SHOUT is a free, confidential, 24/7 text message support service if you're feeling overwhelmed or is struggling to cope. Someone will work with you to take your next steps towards feeling better, helping with issues such as stress, anxiety and depression. They are here to talk at any time - day or night.

If you're under 18, text GREEN to 85258, and if you're 18 and above, text HEAL for immediate support.

### **TELEPHONE**

There are some telephone-based support services you can acces

- The Alder Hey CAMHS 24/7 crisis care team can support you if you're experiencing a mental health crisis. They can also help to keep you safe with advice and support. Freephone 0808 196 3550

### **FACE-TO-FACE**

At YPAS - for children and young people aged 5-25:

- You can drop into any of the three mental health hubs if you need support, Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG) or help with your CAMHS journey.
- Parents/carers can get support in the hubs too, and they can also come along to coffee mornings in the hubs and schools.

The central hub is open Mon-Sat, and the north and south hubs are open Mon - Fri. Opening hours can be found at yypas.org.uk/contact-us/

 Our alternative to crisis support in the mental health hubs means you and members of your family can walk in to get support, therapy and ongoing referral to services, including advice on how to keep you safe if you are experiencing a mental health crisis.

The alternative to crisis support is available Mon-Sat in the central hub and Mon - Fri in the north and south mental health hubs. Opening hours can be found on

### A&E - 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

- Alder Hey will see you if you're under the age of 16.
- Liverpool University Hospitals Accident and Emergency Departments (The Royal & Aintree) will see you if you're aged 16 and above.

You can also speak to whoever initially referred you to CAMHS, for example, your school or your GP, for support.

The Liverpool ASD Training Team are providing a series of virtual <u>drop in</u> advisory sessions via zoom.
