The online application portal is now closed for children starting Reception in September 2025. You can still apply by completing a late application.



Jack Traynor Mass: A Mass will take place at the Cathedral on Tuesday 18th February at 7.00 pm. The Archbishop is the principal celebrant. This Mass is to celebrate the recent acknowledgement of Jack's cure whilst in Lourdes on pilgrimage.

Jack was born in Liverpool and attended St Patrick's Primary School. He left school to become a sailor in the merchant marine. In 1907, he became a stoker in the Royal Navy Reserve, joining the regular Navy at the start of World War 1. Jack was wounded near Bruges on 8th October 1914, but recovered. He was hit by machine gun fire on 8th May 1915 in the Gallipoli campaign, losing the use of his right arm and began to suffer from epilepsy. In April 1920, a surgeon in Liverpool attempted to cure the epilepsy by trepanning, an operation that was reported to have resulted in the partial paralysis of both legs.

In April 1920, Jack travelled to Lourdes with a group of pilgrims from Liverpool, dipping in the baths nine times. Whilst there, he is said to have been cured.

Upon his return to Liverpool, a crown has assembled at Lime Street station to greet his arrival. He started a coal delivery business and returned to Lourdes as a stretcher bearer. Despite the story he is not listed among the verified Lourdes cures. Believers in Lourdes have identified him at the closest British/Irish invalid has every gotten to being officially pronounced a Lourdes miracle.

- · Most courses will have some distance online learning, so a laptop/tablet/smartphone and internet access will be needed to study. You can discuss this when you enrol. We may be able to help.
