


ST Finbar's Newsetter Catholic Primary School April 2025

READING AT HOME

At St Finbar's we strive to build a reading for pleasure culture amongst our children.

Question: How can you help your child before a great reader?

Answer: By reading at home. Children who have high levels of literacy and achieve the best reading score read at home and read for pleasure. At St Finbar's we give your children the tools to be successful readers. For children to be the best readers we need your help in ensuring children read at home too.

Ways to help your child with reading:

- Help your child to make reading a daily habit.
- Talk about new vocabulary with your child so they understand the meaning of new words and phrases.
- Ask questions about what your child is reading.
- Ask them to explain what is happening in the story.
- Make sure your child has a balanced reading diet: are they often reading similar books? Can you guide them to trying new styles and genres?



- Please sign your child's reading card.

ATTENDANCE

As we go into the third and final term of this academic year, the whole school attendance (Nursery to Year 6) stands at 92.32%.

The attendance % from the Government should be at least 97%. As you can see we are nearly 5% below. When children do not attend school they lose out on learning and friendship opportunities. Let us all make a big effort this coming summer term with attendance and improve the school's current attendance percentage.

The Easter Service starts at 9.15 am in the upper hall. All parents/carers are welcome to join us.


MOTHER'S DAY SALE

It can be particularly difficult to know how to support your child with maths at home but you can help develop their maths skills by involving them in everyday activities. If your child can help measure the ingredients when baking or work our which supermarket deal is the cheapest. BOOKING APPOINTMENTS

There are times during a child's school career when parents/carers may need to speak to a member of staff regarding a query or concern. Staff members are always only-too-willing to have these conversations. The majority of these conversations are informal; taking place at the end of the school day. Very rarely do parents/carers request a more formal meeting.

If you need to speak to a member of staff over a query/concern in a more formal way you will be asked the reason for it and to give a little more detail. Such topics of conversation may include:

- SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability)
- Attendance
- Learning (including homework, reading, spellings etc)
- Behaviour
- Safeguarding
- Curriculum (including withdrawal from some aspects)
- Assessment (will my child be sitting tests etc.)
- Other (anything not covered above)



By giving us this information we can then arrange an appointment for you with the most appropriate member of staff. Meetings will be arranged for mutually-convenient times for all involved. Meetings will not be arranged for longer than 20 minutes.
